Revelation 22:6-21 | Have a member of your group read the passage aloud.

⁶ And he said to me, "These words are trustworthy and true. And the Lord, the God of the spirits of the prophets, has sent his angel to show his servants what must soon take place."

⁷ "And behold, I am coming soon. Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy of this book."

⁸ I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I heard and saw them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who showed them to me, ⁹ but he said to me, "You must not do that! I am a fellow servant with you and your brothers the prophets, and with those who keep the words of this book. Worship God."

¹⁰ And he said to me, "Do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near. ¹¹ Let the evildoer still do evil, and the filthy still be filthy, and the righteous still do right, and the holy still be holy."

 confess and submit to the sanctifying work of the Spirit?
- Revelation 22:16-17 reads of Jesus' invitation to come to the Lord. Have you answered Jesus' invitation to come? If you have, share about the moment you first responded. How do we continue to respond today to this call today?
- Part of preparing for Jesus' return is sharing his invitation with others. Describe your understanding
 of the responsibility we as believers have to make disciples of people from other cultures and
 nations?
